

Nature Exchange is a turnkey, modular experience that fuses real-world discovery with interactive learning and a visitor app—designed to drive repeat visits and memberships.

Explorers of all ages can learn about the great outdoors, trade their discoveries, and swap stories—all in exchange for something new!

Curiosity is the most valuable thing you can bring. Found a cool rock, sketched an insect, or have a great field story? Share it at a Nature Exchange location to earn points to trade for new treasures.

Anyone can swap treasures for points—and the more you learn, the more you earn. Knowledge counts as much as the object. Each trade sparks conversation and discovery, turning exploration into a lasting connection with the natural world.

The Nature Exchange turnkey package includes all training, software, hardware, equipment, and cabinetry to install a complete visitor experience that attracts repeat visits.

NATURE EXCHANGE CULTIVATES ENTHUSIASM FOR NATURE

Nature Exchange is a unique concept founded on the belief that we learn best from our day-to-day activities. Exploring the world outside our doors, picking up and handling real things, and engaging in conversation with meaningful people in our lives – these are fundamental in forming the framework for much of our understanding and respect for the natural world.

NATURE EXCHANGE INSPIRES SELF-MOTIVATED LEARNING

It encourages curiosity, observation, and learning by collecting, studying, and talking about what explorers see and learn about in nature. It helps people connect with the environment and get excited about learning on their own.

NATURE EXCHANGE TEACHES THE VALUE OF KNOWLEDGE

Nature Exchange allows you to trade items and share what you've learned — not with money, but with knowledge. It's about being curious, collecting responsibly, and discovering that the real value lies not with the item itself, but with the experience of learning and sharing.



HOW VISITORS LEARN AT NATURE EXCHANGE

Science North (Canada) and Techniquest (UK) studied how children learn through Nature Exchange. They found that there are eight learning behaviours, which can be grouped into three stages showing how visitors get more involved and interact deeper.

1 Getting Started — Feeling Safe

Visitors need to feel comfortable before jumping in. At this stage, they:

- Try the activity out
- Watch others do it
- Ask staff or other visitors for help

This helps them feel confident enough to take part.

2 Getting Interested — Feeling Excited

Visitors start to enjoy the activity and want to do more. They:

- Repeat the activity
- Show excitement (like smiling or laughing)

This shows they're ready to dig deeper and learn more.

3 Getting Involved — Feeling Connected

Visitors are now fully engaged. They:

- Connect the activity to their own life
- Ask questions and share what they know
- Compare items and test ideas

This is where real learning happens. Visitors often move through the first two stages quickly and reach this deeper level of engagement.

When you purchase a Nature Exchange you will get access to a multi-platform interface that includes a trading database for the host and an interactive app for your visitors.

Database

Our Nature Exchange database gives host locations powerful tools to manage and grow their program. This system allows hosts to create and manage user information, manage their inventory and connect to the Nature Exchange community. It offers multilingual support, rich user profiles, and a modern, intuitive interface that simplifies daily operations.

The App

The new Nature Exchange app brings the wonder of the outdoors right to your visitor's phone. Instead of collecting physical objects, users can explore nature, snap photos of what they discover, and earn points.

The app turns every exchange into a game. Users can unlock achievement badges, complete collectible sets, level up their nature knowledge, and even keep a journal with photos and notes. With optional challenges, the app helps users learn about species, ecosystems, and the environment around them.

For host locations, the app offers full flexibility: create custom challenges, badges, and point systems. A simple dashboard makes it easy to release new content, track engagement, and access meaningful analytics. **Why it's a game-changer:**

- Encourages exploration and curiosity
- Expands the Nature Exchange program without requiring physical objects
- Supports a “leave no trace” approach
- Builds a connected, engaged community
- Drives visits back to science centres



ETHICAL COLLECTING AND LEAVE NO TRACE POLICY

In order to acknowledge each institution's important philosophical, ethical and legal responsibilities, criteria have been established to facilitate public understanding and daily operations.

Statement of Responsibility

Educational institutions that care about nature and biodiversity should lead by:

- Teaching conservation values and encouraging people to live by them.
- Creating a culture that cares for all living things.
- Supporting laws and agreements about collecting, owning, and trading natural items.

Protect Trees and Plants

- Don't hammer nails into trees, cut them, or tie ropes around trunks.
- Don't carve into trees or cut branches for bedding — it harms them and helps little.

Respect the Natural Site

- Leave the area as you found it. Don't dig, build structures, or make changes.
- If you move items like rocks, sticks, or pinecones, put them back before you leave.
- At heavily used sites, clean up and remove things like extra fire rings or homemade furniture.

Leave What You Find

- Leave rocks, plants, antlers, artifacts, and other natural or cultural items for others to enjoy.
- In many parks, it's illegal to take anything from nature.

Nature Exchange guidelines may differ depending on the institution, its beliefs, and where it's located.

Here's an example of some trading guidelines from The Dallas Zoo's Nature Exchange:

- No items will be traded from the institution's collection, living or dead, plant or animal.
- No items regulated by the U.S. Endangered Species Act, or other local, national or international regulations or agreements, will be traded. Specific requirements for confiscation and reporting will be strictly adhered to (e.g., no eggs, feathers or nests).
- No items that involve taxidermy, whether skins, furs or mounted specimens will be traded.
- "Killed" items will not be accepted for trading; however, points will be awarded for information, sharing and understanding. Items will be sent home with suggestions for disposal.
- "Hunted" items will be accepted for trade; however, fewer points will be awarded than if the item was "found".
- "Found" items will be accepted for trade, based upon legal, ethical and sanitary considerations.
